# So You're Writing a LEARN Reflection...

## **SET THE SCENE**

- Identify the event/experience on which you will reflect using the 4 W's:
  - 1. **What** happened & what did you feel (try to use all your senses)?
  - 2. When did this happen (i.e. in first week of clinical....)?
  - 3. Where did this happen?
  - 4. **Who** was involved?\*
- \* Remember confidentiality is important! Use substitutions such as Nurse "A"/Patient "X"
- Identify the main issue you will be reflecting on taken from your experience:

# **Clinical Event**

On the first day of my long-term care clinical placement, the nurses expressed negative feelings towards the nursing profession, and frustration with being overworked

### **Main Issue**

Nursing burn-out in long term care

#### LITERATURE REVIEW

- Use scholarly sources to demonstrate your understanding:
  - o *Relate* your insights to literature
  - o *Connect* theory and practice
  - o *Identify* professional and personal development **needs**
  - o *Identify* ways the nursing profession can benefit from changes discussed in literature
  - o *Support* your ideas for future clinical experiences
- Remember to check:
  - o Primary versus secondary sources
  - Publication date restrictions
  - o Minimum number of references required
  - Specific journal sources required
  - o Specifically for nurses: Potter & Perry usually does not apply as a primary source
